William Hiram Benthall was "mustered" into the Civil War on 9 Dec 1861 in Company F, 60th Indiana Infantry. He re-enlisted again in 1864. Before the close of the war, companies F and D were consolidated. He was "mustered" out of Co. F and D, 60 Indiana Infantry in March 21, 1865. He first served as a bugle boy.

While on furlough in 1864, he married Sarah Jane Wilson Sturdevant in Jefferson Co., IL in the home of Bob Clampet. They spent all but two years of their married life in the SW part of Jefferson Co. They lived two years in northern Franklin Co. They were married about 65 years.

He spent most of his young life until the Civil War on a farm near Mount Vernon, IN. One story has it that W. H. Benthall was brought to Illinois by his aunt, Becky Harris. It is now known that he lived with his uncle Reuben Benthall after the death of his parents. It was Reuben that brought him to Illinois - first to Perry, then to Jefferson Co.

William H. is found in the home of Rueben Benthall (his father's brother) in Jeffeson Co. in in 1860 Cencus. Alice Benthall Black states that he was brought to Jefferson Co. by his aunt Rachel Harris. Perhaps she is some relation to William Harris was was the administrator of William's father's will in 1952.

#### Notes from Peggy Claire:

William Hardy Benthall was born to Cornelius and Rachel Benthall in Black Township, Posey County, Indiana.

After his parents'and the deaths of his two brothers Elijah and Joel in 1852, he resided with his uncle Reuben Benthall. He probably is the William A. or R. Benthall, 9 years of age, who is with Reuben and Elizabeth Benthall in Tamaro Township, Jefferson County, Illinois in the 1860 Census. (Errors were made in the age of other family members compared to their ages in the 1850 Black Township, Posey County, Indiana Census.) He spent most of his young life until the Civil War on a farms either in Indiana or Illinois. One story has it that he was brought to Illinois by his aunt, Becky (Mrs. William) Harris, but it would appear that it was his Uncle Reuben who brought him first to Perry and then to Jefferson County.

William Benthall enlisted in the Civil War at Mt. Vernon, Indiana, on 09 December 1861, as an 18 year old private into Company F, 60th Indiana Infantry for three years. He re-inlisted again on 25 February, 1864, at c, Louisiana,

and served until the end of the war.

His personal description at enlistment was as follows: "Height 5 feet 10 inches; complexion, light, color of eyes, dark, color of hair, dark, that his occupation was farmer."

Before the close of the war, companies F and D were consolidated. He served in various capacities including being a bugel boy, with the Pioneer Corps, as a teamster, and performing guard duty. The unit was stationed at many different places in the south, primarily at Munfordville, Kentucky; New Orleans and Thibadeaux, Louisiana; Vicksburg, Mississippi; Arkansas, and Texas. In this unit, three officers and 165 enlisted men lost their lives during service, a total of 312. He was "mustered" out of Co. F and D, 60 Indiana Infantry in 21 March, 1865 at Indianapolis, Marion Co., Indiana.

*He later received a pension from the government for his service from about 1912 til his death in December, 1930, amounting to a rate of \$100 per month.*

Sarah died 18 November, 1929, at 89 years of age, with cause of death being "carcenoma of tyloma."

William died at the age of 86 years of age 23 December 1930, at Waltonville, Illinois. The cause of William's death was cronic endocarditis. Two of his obituaries read as follows:

"W.H. Benthall Died Today At An Early Hour/Was Waltonville's Grand Old Man and Loved And Respected By All Who Knew Him/Last Survivor of Civil War There/Was Born in 1844 and Spent Many Years As Farmer in Bald Hill, Locating in Waltonville 25 Years Ago"

William H. Benthall, one of the most highly respected men in Jefferson County, died at the family home in Waltonville at an early hour this morning. Mr. Benthall arose, apparently in his usual health, ate breakfast, and did chores about the place, returned to the house, complained of feeling unwell, lay down and died in a very short time.

*Mr.* Benthall was born January 24, 1844, and spent the greater part of life in Bald Hill township. About 25 years ago he located in Waltonville where he remained until his death. Mrs. Benthall died November 18, 1929.

Mr. Benthall is survided by three sons and four daughter as follows:

David, Harvy, and Jim, of Waltonville, and Mrs. Ed Robinson, Mrs. Evan Sulcer, Mrs. Jack Davis, Waltonville, and Mrs Harl Hill of Peoria.

Funeral services will be held Wednesaday afternoon at 1 o'clock at Dryden cemetery, conducted by the Rev. C. W. Maulding.

Mr. Benthall served in the Civil War and was the last survivor of the war living in Waltonville or vicinity.

He and his wife enjoyed a married life of considerably more than 50 years.

He was one of the most popular men who ever lived in Waltonville, and was universally loved and respected. He was of a cheerful, sunny disposition, and ever had a cheerful greeting and pleasant word for all. Citizens of Waltonville pay tribute to him as a man and citizen and say he will be missed in the community of which he formed a part so many long years.

He farmed in Bald Hill township many years.

*Mr.* Benthall was well known to many *Mt*. Vernon people and was loved and respected by all who had the pleasure of his acquaintance in *Mt*. Vernon as well as in the locality in which he lived.

Aged Loved And Respected Citizen Passes To His Reward

William Benthall, son of Cornelius and Rachel Benthall, was born January 20, 1844, near Mt. Vernon, Posey County, Indiana, and was the last survivor of a family of three sisters and five brothers.

At an early age he enlisted in the Civil War, December 9, 1861, with Company F, 60th Indiana Infantry. At expiration of his term of service, Company F and D having been consolidated, he again enlisted and was mustered out with the Company in March 1865. Having served his country in her time of need for a period of three years, three months, and 17 days.

In the year 1864, while at home on furlough, Mr. Benthall was united in marriage to Sarah Jane Wilson Sturdevant who a short time ago preceeded him in death.

To Mr. and Mrs. Benthall were born four daughter and three sons, all of whom survive. Namely: Harvey, Mrs. Martha Davis, Mrs. Rachel Robertson, and Mrs. Cora Sulcer of Waltonville: James of Scheller; Dave of Elkville, and Mrs Julia Hill of Peoria, Illinois; also 24 grandchildren and 21 great grandchildren.

The greater part of their married life was spent in Jefferson County. For a number of years the family home having been in Waltonville.

Mr. Benthall's church membership was with the Missionary Baptist Church, of which for many years he has been an ardent supporter. Well respected by neighbors and all who knew him, he was a most useful citizen, having served his township as supervisor and in various other capacities. As a farmer, success crowned his efforts, he having

amassed enough of the world's goods to enable him to retire from active labor in his declining years -- yet not withstanding, the loving ministrations of children and friends, it seemed he was unable to rally from the shock associated by death of his beloved companion with whom he had been associated for so many years and when on the of December twenty third the Great Commander summoned to answer to "The Last Roll Call."

Mrs. Sarah Jane Benthall, wife of Wm. H. Benthall, passed serenely into the kingdom of heaven at her home in Waltonville, Ill., at 5 a.m., Nov. 18, 1929. Death was not unexpected as her condition had been such for the last few days that it was realized death was a question of but a comparatively short time. Sarah J. Wilson was the daughter of Jerry and Eliza Wilson, of near Tamaroa, Perry county, Illinois, where the subject of this sketch was born, June 4, 1840, where she spent most of her life until her marriage to Harvey Sturdevant, which occurred April 20, 1858, he died Nov. 1858. She was again married to Wm. H. Benthall, while he was home on a furlough, April 21, 1864, at Robert Clampet's, by John B. Ward. Her age, was 89 years, 5 months, and 14 days.

#### Funeral sermon of Harvey C. Benthall:

The announcement of his death will bring sorrow, to his many friends, He was the eldest son of the late Wm H. and Sarah Wilson Benthall, was born in Franklin Co. Ill, Jan 15 1865 and was seventy years, and eleven months at the time of his demise. He moved with his parents to Jeff. county when quite young, and has resided there most of his life except a few years spend in the West, where he was married to Miss Eva Smith, at Hood River, Oregon April-1-1892. This this union three children were born namely, Mrs. Alice L. Black of Waltonville, Ill, Ardyce, who died at Mt. Vernon Hospital, Dec-26-1920, and an infant daughter who died many years ago. His wife died May-6-1912, leaving the care of the two small children to the father and her last words to him were, "Be good to the girls," and he has fully lived up to his promise to her, by being a kind and loving father. Beside the daughter he leaves two granddaughters, Rose Marie and Evalina (sic), with whom he was been so closely associated. Also two brothers and four sisters - James W. Benthall of Scheller, Ill., David G. Benthall of Du quoin Ill. Mrs. Julia Hill, of Peoria Ill., Mrs. Rachel Robinson, Mrs. Martha Davis, Mrs. Cora Sulcer of Waltonville, Mr. Benthall being the eldest of a family of seven children and the first to pass to the "Great Beyond." After the death of his wife, he with his two daughters, moved to Waltonville where he has since resided. After his marriage in the west, he returned to Ill. where he was engaged in farming, and stock raising, and in his active years, ranked as one of Jefferson county's successful farmers. Mr. Benthall was of a very kind disposition, and when one leaves us who has not only been a kind neighbor, and loving father, and has made an unusual contribution to the life of a community in which he lived, we feel the loss more keenly. He was a man of many virtues absolutely unselfish, freely making any sacrifice, that might benefit his lived ones. Mr. Benthall had been a constant sufferer, for several years and although his sufferings were intense, no murmur or complaint came from his lips, the Lord was his Shepherd and led him safely through the dark valley of sickness and as the sun of life was sinking in the West, we believe he heard the Masters call, "It is enough, come home," and with a song of victory, his spirit winged its flight, through the gates ajar, into the havens of rest, ever to be with his lived ones and sing the praises of his redeemer. -- Cora Hartley

Alice, Ed, Rose Marie and Evalena lived with him. I can remember he wanted me to get old enough to ride to the farm with him in his buggy. Also we would walk to the post office and he would buy me candy from the Clover Farm Store across the street from the post office. We would then sit on the Library steps just back of the post office and eat the candy.
